Sunday Mass will be livestreamed from Our Lady of Kāpiti Church at 9.30am celebrated by Fr Michael McCabe.

Our weekday and weekend Masses will resume next week under Covid-19 restrictions.

Sunday 17 October 9.30am (this Mass will be livestreamed as well as people in attendance)

Please note that we are still under Level 2 restrictions, so maximum capacity of 100 people at each Mass. You must register for **one Mass only per week**. This is so everyone has a chance to attend Mass each week. Could you please only register one week at a time.

To register for <u>one</u> Mass only, go to the link <u>https://forms.gle/2FvBEZmmHNssiRjN8</u>; or if you are unable to have access to a computer, please call the office and leave a message. <u>You will only be notified if we have reached capacity of 100</u>.

The following precautions **must** be in place:

- Everyone must scan the QR code or sign in on the day (individually only, not as couples or families);
- Sanitise your hands;
- Strongly encourage people to wear masks as recommended by the Ministry of Health and endorsed by Cardinal John Dew;
- Communion under one kind only, the Body of the Lord, in the hand only, no exceptions;
- Contactless Sign of Peace;
- Please do not rearrange the chairs as they are arranged for social distancing;
- No congregational Singing.

Cardinal John advises that if people are concerned or cautious, vulnerable and at risk because of age or underlying health conditions, you are dispensed from Sunday Mass.
